

## The Religion of Evolution, Part 3

The fourth bridge that no Evolutionist has ever crossed is the bridge of MAN'S BODY. The Apostle Paul writes:

1 Co 15:39, "All flesh is not the same flesh, but there is one kind of flesh of men, another flesh of animals, another of fish, and another of birds." NKJV

The most abominable practice conceivable is that of cannibalism—the eating of human flesh. Only depraved, degraded humans can allow for that practice and we note this practice is usually done in secret because the cannibal's conscience declares it is evil. God bore this out in His instructions to Noah and his descendants as they left the ark. They could kill and consume every moving thing however when it came to humans, their death (and consumption) was declared a sin worthy of death.

Gen. 9:3-6, "Every moving thing that lives shall be food for you. I have given you all things, even as the green herbs. But you shall not eat flesh with its life, that is, its blood. Surely for your lifeblood I will demand a reckoning; from the hand of every beast I will require it, and from the hand of man. From the hand of every man's brother I will require the life of man. "Whoever sheds man's blood, By man his blood shall be shed; For in the image of God He made man." NKJV

Therefore the blood of humans is truly unique from all animals. The flesh of the cow, the blood of the goat, the chromosome number of the monkey, the blubber of the whale, or the temperature of the fish, NONE OF THESE have any relation to the structure of man's body. No blood transfusion works between man and beast, fowl or fish. Man is uniquely different from all other creature. This was one of the first lessons God taught man in the garden.

Gen. 2:19-20. "Out of the ground the Lord God formed every beast of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to Adam to see what he would call them. And whatever Adam called each living creature, that was its name. 20 So Adam gave names to all cattle, to the birds of the air, and to every beast of the field. But for Adam there was not found a helper comparable to him." NKJV

The fifth bridge that no Evolutionist has ever crossed is the bridge of MORPHOLOGY, the posture of animals. Animals are constructed that they may look to man, whereas man is constructed so that he can look to God. Man's knees are bent to pray however the hind legs of most animals that cannot do that. God created man's body to be indwelt with God the Holy Spirit at man's salvation (1 Cor. 12:12-14). No animal is created capable of being the vessel of God's Spirit.

Man, unlike animals, stands erect with his eyes on the horizon. His legs enable him to straddle a horse, his nimble fingers to milk the cow, his keen ears to help detect the serpent in the bush, his sharp eyes to see the distant fowl and etc. Truly the human body of man though it has qualities like the animals, is superior in every way. As David ably put it:

Ps. 139:14, "I will praise You, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; Marvelous are Your works, And that my soul knows very well." NKJV

The sixth bridge that no Evolutionist has ever crossed is the bridge of RESURRECTION. Only to man has God given the promise of physical bodily resurrection from the death and the grave.

Jn. 5:26-29, "For as the Father has life in Himself, so He has granted the Son to have life in Himself, and has given Him authority to execute judgment also, because He is the Son of Man. Do not marvel at this; for the hour is coming in which **all who are in the graves will hear His voice and come forth** — those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of condemnation." NKJV

1 Co 15:21-23, "For since by man came death, **by Man also came the resurrection of the dead.** For as in Adam all die, even so in Christ all shall be made alive." NKJV

Black graphite of the pencil, lamp black, white house paint, carbon in the motor, or the sparkling beautiful diamond all have the same common denominator, they are all made of carbon. Acts 17:32<sub>1</sub> tells us, "And when they heard of the resurrection of the dead, some mocked." You know what? We see the same reaction in our day along with the false teaching of reincarnation trying to take its place. The physical resurrection of the dead, with the body coming alive from the grave is NOT a biological evolution, but rather the direct result of the finished work of Christ Jesus.

Animals do not share in this victorious working of God in man's body in that future day when death is swallowed up in victory. Thank God for his Son the Lord Jesus Christ, who through his own death and physical bodily resurrection from the grave gives us far more than just the promise of our own resurrection. It also gives to us the guarantee of a vastly improved body and life at its fullest forever more.

1 Co 15:42-45, "So also is the resurrection of the dead. The body is sown in corruption, it is raised in incorruption. It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised in power. It is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body, and there is a spiritual body. And so it is written, "The first man Adam became a living being." The last Adam became a life-giving spirit." NKJV

1 Co 15:50-54, "Now this I say, brethren, that flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God; nor does corruption inherit incorruption. Behold, I tell you a mystery: We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed — in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. For this

corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality. So when this corruptible has put on incorruption, and this mortal has put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." NKJV

The Bible teaches us that after our own resurrection we will spend eternity either in Heaven with the Lord Jesus Christ or in torment in an everlasting, never ending lake of fire (Rev. 20:1-15). All of this is dependant upon what we have done with the Lord Jesus and the price he paid for us on the cross through His death and resurrection.
